Women, Business and the Law 2024 (WBL 2024) identifies barriers for women's economic empowerment in three areas: women's legal rights, policy instruments designed to support the implementation of these rights, and how these rights are realized in practice. For that purpose, three new Women, Business and the Law 2.0 indexes are presented for ten indicators: (1) legal frameworks, (2) supportive frameworks, and (3) expert opinions. For the WBL 2.0 legal frameworks index, 40 questions are scored across the ten indicators for 190 economies. For the WBL 2.0 supportive frameworks index, 30 questions are scored across the ten indicators for 190 economies. Overall economy level legal and supportive frameworks scores are then calculated by taking the average of each indicator, with 100 representing the highest possible score. The WBL 2.0 expert opinions index is created for a total of 164 economies. Expert opinion scores are not available for 26 economies due to an insufficient number of responses received from those economies during data collection. Individual responses at the economy level for 15 expert opinions questions across the ten indicators are scored by taking the median value of all responses per question. The economy level expert opinions index is equal to the simple unweighted average of the ten indicator scores.

For Malawi, data refer to the legal frameworks, supportive frameworks, and expert opinions that are applicable to the main business city (Blantyre). The scores for Malawi are shown in the table below.

In summary, the **WBL 2.0 legal frameworks score** for Malawi (57.5 out of 100.0) is lower than the global average (64.2) and higher than the Sub-Saharan Africa regional average (57.4). When it comes to laws affecting women's pay, constraints related to marriage and laws affecting women's property and inheritance, Malawi obtains a perfect score (100.0 out of 100.0). As an example, one of the lowest scores for Malawi is on the indicator measuring laws affecting childcare. To improve on the Childcare indicator, Malawi may wish to consider legally establishing provision of childcare services in center-based settings, introducing legislation on any form of support to families for childcare services, putting in place legislation on any form of support to non-state childcare providers and adopting legislation on quality standards for the provision of childcare services in center-based settings.

The WBL 2.0 supportive frameworks score for Malawi (29.2 out of 100.0) is lower than the global average (39.5) and higher than the Sub-Saharan Africa regional average (24.5). Malawi does not attain a perfect score on any of the WBL 2.0 supportive frameworks indicators. There is room for improvement across all ten indicators. As an example, one of the lowest



scores for Malawi is on the indicator measuring supportive frameworks affecting women's decisions to work. To improve on the Workplace indicator, Malawi may wish to consider publishing guidelines on non-discrimination based on gender in recruitment, publishing guidelines on flexible work arrangements and establishing a specialized body that receives complaints about gender discrimination in employment.

The **WBL 2.0 expert opinions score** for Malawi (65.0 out of 100.0) is lower than the global average (65.7) and higher than the Sub-Saharan Africa regional average (54.6). When it comes to expert opinions on freedom of movement, expert opinions on women's property and inheritance and expert opinions on women's pensions, Malawi obtains a perfect score (100.0 out of 100.0). As an example, one of the lowest scores for Malawi is on the indicator measuring expert opinions on women's safety.


