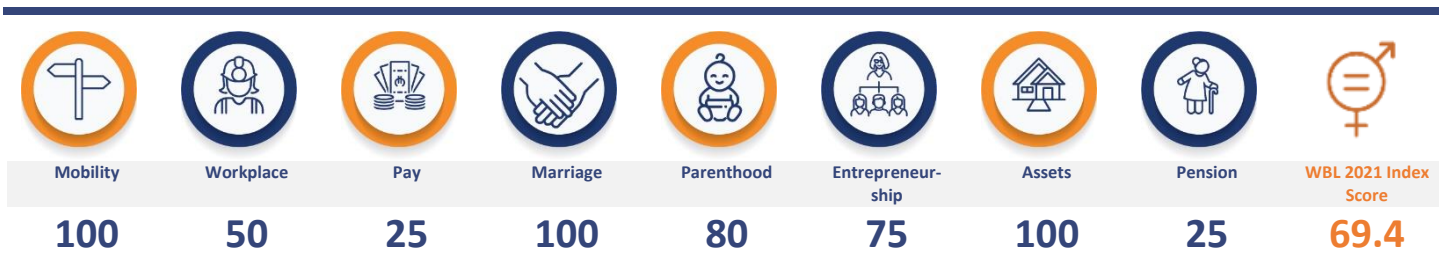


# Kazakhstan

*Women, Business and the Law 2021* presents an index covering 190 economies and structured around the life cycle of a working woman. In total, 35 questions are scored across the eight indicators. Overall scores are then calculated by taking the average of each indicator, with 100 representing the highest possible score. Data refer to the laws and regulations that are applicable to the main business city (Almaty). Different rules may apply in other jurisdictions so local legislation should be reviewed. Based on this approach, **Kazakhstan scores 69.4 out of 100**. The overall score for Kazakhstan is lower than the regional average observed across Europe & Central Asia (83.4). Within the Europe & Central Asia region, the maximum score observed is 93.8 (Croatia and Serbia).

### Relative Strengths

When it comes to constraints on freedom of movement, constraints related to marriage, and gender differences in property and inheritance, Kazakhstan gets a perfect score.

### Areas for Improvement

However, when it comes to laws affecting women's decisions to work, laws affecting women's pay, laws affecting women's work after having children, constraints on women's starting and running a business, and laws affecting the size of a woman's pension, Kazakhstan could consider reforms to improve legal equality for women.

For example, one of the lowest scores for Kazakhstan is on the indicator related to laws affecting women's pay (the WBL2021 Pay Indicator). To improve on the Pay Indicator, Kazakhstan may wish to consider mandating equal remuneration for work of equal value, allowing women to work in jobs deemed dangerous in the same way as men, and allowing women to work in an industrial job in the same way as men.

### Recent Reforms

No reforms were observed during the past year.
