

Bahamas, The

Women, Business and the Law 2022 (WBL2022) presents an index covering 190 economies and structured around the life cycle of a working woman. In total, 35 questions are scored across eight indicators. Overall scores are then calculated by taking the average of each indicator, with 100 representing the highest possible score. Data refer to the laws and regulations that are applicable to the main business city (Nassau). Different rules may apply in other jurisdictions so local legislation should be reviewed. Based on this approach, **The Bahamas scores 81.3 out of 100**. The overall score for The Bahamas is higher than the regional average observed across Latin America and the Caribbean (80.4). Within the Latin America and the Caribbean region, the maximum score observed is 95 (Peru).

Relative Strengths

When it comes to constraints on freedom of movement, laws affecting women's decisions to work, gender differences in property and inheritance, and laws affecting the size of a woman's pension, The Bahamas gets a perfect score.

Areas for Improvement

However, when it comes to laws affecting women's pay, constraints related to marriage, laws affecting women's work after having children, and constraints on women starting and running a business, The Bahamas could consider reforms to improve legal equality for women.

For example, one of the lowest scores for The Bahamas is on the indicator measuring laws affecting women's work after having children (the WBL2022 Parenthood indicator). To improve on the Parenthood indicator, The Bahamas may wish to consider making paid leave of at least 14 weeks available to mothers, making the government administer 100% of maternity leave benefits, making paid leave available to fathers, and making paid parental leave available.

Recent Reforms

No reforms were observed during the past year (October 2nd, 2020 – October 1st, 2021).
