

# Syrian Arab Republic

*Women, Business and the Law 2022* (WBL2022) presents an index covering 190 economies and structured around the life cycle of a working woman. In total, 35 questions are scored across eight indicators. Overall scores are then calculated by taking the average of each indicator, with 100 representing the highest possible score. Data refer to the laws and regulations that are applicable to the main business city (Damascus). Different rules may apply in other jurisdictions so local legislation should be reviewed. Based on this approach, **Syrian Arab Republic scores 40 out of 100**. The overall score for Syrian Arab Republic is lower than the regional average observed across the Middle East and North Africa (53). Within the Middle East and North Africa region, the maximum score observed is 88.8 (Malta).

### Relative Strengths

Syrian Arab Republic does not attain a perfect score on any of the WBL2022 indicators. There is room for improvement across all eight indicators.

### Areas for Improvement

However, when it comes to constraints on freedom of movement, laws affecting women's decisions to work, laws affecting women's pay, constraints related to marriage, laws affecting women's work after having children, constraints on women starting and running a business, gender differences in property and inheritance, and laws affecting the size of a woman's pension, Syrian Arab Republic could consider reforms to improve legal equality for women.

For example, one of the lowest scores for Syrian Arab Republic is on the indicator measuring laws affecting women's pay (the WBL2022 Pay indicator). To improve on the Pay indicator, Syrian Arab Republic may wish to consider mandating equal remuneration for work of equal value, allowing women to work at night in the same way as men, allowing women to work in jobs deemed dangerous in the same way as men, and allowing women to work in an industrial job in the same way as men.

### Recent Reforms

No reforms were observed during the past year (October 2nd, 2020 – October 1st, 2021).
