# Ghana

Women, Business and the Law 2023 (WBL2023) presents an index covering 190 economies and structured around the life cycle of a working woman. In total, 35 questions are scored across eight indicators. Overall scores are then calculated by taking the average of each indicator, with 100 representing the highest possible score. Data refer to the laws and regulations that are applicable to the main business city (Accra). Different rules may apply in other jurisdictions so local legislation should be reviewed. Based on this approach, **Ghana scores 75 out of 100.** The overall score for Ghana is higher than the regional average observed across Sub-Saharan Africa (72.6). Within the Sub-Saharan Africa region, the maximum score observed is 95 (Côte d'Ivoire and Gabon).

## **Relative Strengths**

When it comes to constraints on freedom of movement, laws affecting women's decisions to work, and constraints related to marriage, Ghana gets a perfect score.

## **Areas for Improvement**

However, when it comes to laws affecting women's pay, laws affecting women's work after having children, constraints on women starting and running a business, gender differences in property and inheritance, and laws affecting the size of a woman's pension, Ghana could consider reforms to improve legal equality for women.

For example, one of the lowest scores for Ghana is on the indicator measuring laws affecting women's work after having children (the WBL2023 Parenthood indicator). To improve on the Parenthood indicator, Ghana may wish to consider making paid leave of at least 14 weeks available to mothers, making the government administer 100% of maternity leave benefits, making paid leave available to fathers, and making paid parental leave available.

#### **Recent Reforms**

No reforms were observed during the past year (October 2nd, 2021 - October 1st, 2022).
