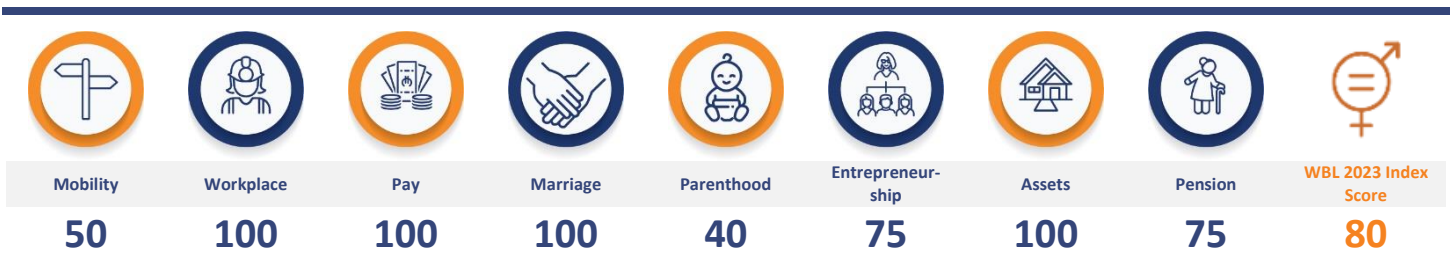


# Malawi

*Women, Business and the Law 2023 (WBL2023)* presents an index covering 190 economies and structured around the life cycle of a working woman. In total, 35 questions are scored across eight indicators. Overall scores are then calculated by taking the average of each indicator, with 100 representing the highest possible score. Data refer to the laws and regulations that are applicable to the main business city (Blantyre). Different rules may apply in other jurisdictions so local legislation should be reviewed. Based on this approach, **Malawi scores 80 out of 100**. The overall score for Malawi is higher than the regional average observed across Sub-Saharan Africa (72.6). Within the Sub-Saharan Africa region, the maximum score observed is 95 (Côte d'Ivoire and Gabon).

### Relative Strengths

When it comes to laws affecting women's decisions to work, laws affecting women's pay, constraints related to marriage, and gender differences in property and inheritance, Malawi gets a perfect score.

### Areas for Improvement

However, when it comes to constraints on freedom of movement, laws affecting women's work after having children, constraints on women starting and running a business, and laws affecting the size of a woman's pension, Malawi could consider reforms to improve legal equality for women.

For example, one of the lowest scores for Malawi is on the indicator measuring laws affecting women's work after having children (the WBL2023 Parenthood indicator). To improve on the Parenthood indicator, Malawi may wish to consider making paid leave of at least 14 weeks available to mothers, making the government administer 100% of maternity leave benefits, and making paid parental leave available.

### Recent Reforms

During the past year (October 2nd, 2021 to October 1st, 2022), Malawi introduced paid paternity leave.
